This Indenture made this eighth Day of March Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred and fifty eight and in the thirty second year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second by the Grace of God of great Britain France and Ireland King Defendant of the Faith &c Between Henry Vaughan of Southampton County Planter and Ann his Wife of the one Part and William Hennebree of the same County Planter of the other Part Witnesseth that the said Henry Vaughan and Ann his Wife for and in Consideration of the Sum of fourteen Pounds Current Money of Virginia to the said Henry Vaughan in Hand paid by the said William Hennebree, the Receipt whereof the said Henry Vaughan and Ann his Wife do hereby acknowledge That they the said Henry Vaughan and Ann his Wife have granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and Confirmed and by these Presents do Grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and Confirm unto the William Hennebree his Heirs and Assigns for ever one certain Tract or Parcel of Land containing two hundred and twenty one Acres lying and being in the County of Southampton on the South Side of Nettoway River eighty five Acres of which Land was granted unto Henry Vaughan bearing Date the tenth Day of July one thousand seven hundred and fifty five and one hundred and thirty six Acres of the same Land was granted to the said Henry Vaughan bearing Date the sixteenth Day of August one thousand seven hundred and fifty six and bounded as followeth Beginning at three Trees chopd inwards in Richard Shirley Juniors Line thence South sixty four Degrees then East fifty two Poles to a Lightwood Post in William Pittles Line thence by the said Pittles Line South ten Degrees East one hundred and forty Poles to a Pine South Eighty Degrees West forty six Poles to a white Oak from the said White Oak a Corner of William Pittles Line running by the said Pittles Line South ten Degrees West one hundred and sixty Poles to a black Oak and South sixty Degrees East Eighteen Poles to a spanish Oak a Corner of
