come that We Richard Johnson and Martha my Wife send greeting in our
Lord God everlasting Know ye that We Richard Johnson and Martha my
wife of the County of Southampton in Virginia and Parish of Mothersey
for the Love and Affection that We Richard Johnson and Martha my Wife
bear unto our Son Richard Johnson we the said Richard Johnson and
Martha my Wife being in perfect Memory have given granted and
confirmed and by this our Present Writing do firmly freely and
absolutely give unto our Son Richard Johnson his Heirs or Assigns
for ever as followeth that is to say I give unto my Son Richard
Johnson and his Heirs or Assigns forever one hundred Acres of Land
lying on White Root Branch bounded &c to wit Beginning at
a White Oak on White Root thence running up a straight Line to a red
Oak a corner Tree thence along a straight Line to a Pine a corner
Tree thence down Washington Line to a Hickory a corner Tree thence
thence along Flowers Line to the Beginning the said Land being
by a Deed granted to me the said Richard Johnson from Jacob Barnes
which I do firmly freely and absolutely give unto my Son Richard
Johnson and his Heirs or Assigns forever For Witness hereunto
We have set our hands and fixed our seals this 13th Day of April
1758

greeting Know ye that I Francis Sharpe of Southampton County
for diverse good Causes and Considerations but more especially in Consi-
deration of the Love and Affection I bear to my Son Groves Sharpe do give
Grant and Confirm unto the said Groves Sharpe a certain Parcel of Land
situate on the South Side of flatt Swamp containing one hundred and fifty
Acres (more or less) being Part of a Tract granted to Francis Sharpe Senior
bearing Date by Patent the seventeenth Day of September one thousand
seven hundred and thirty one and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning
at a Hickory a Line Tree between the said Francis Sharpe and Amos Jamies
chopt inward thence Eastward along a Line of marked Trees to a Branch
thence down the said Branch to the old Line thence Southwardly
