 named Amekone & one girl child named Annaca — To have and to hold the said Three Negroes
 with their Increase unto the said John Gilliam his Executors Admors & assigns forever & the said
 Richard Kirby for myself Executors Admors the said Bargained Slaves unto the said John Gilliam
 his Executors Admors & assigns against all persons shall & will warrant & for ever Defend by these
 presents provided always & upon this Condition Never the less that If the said Richard Kirby or my
 Executors Admors. do & shall will & truly pay or Cause to be paid unto the said John Gilliam his Executors
 or assigns the full & just sum of one hundred pounds current money of Virginia at or upon the
 first Day of March next ensuing the Date hereof with the Lawfull Interest thereon from the Day of the Date
 of these presents that then this present Bill of Sale & every Clause therein contained shall cease Determine
 & be utterly void to all intents & purposes Otherwise to remain in full force power & Virtue In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Nineteenth day of March 1759 —

 & confirmed & by these presents both grant bargain & sell Allien En feoff & confirm unto the said
 Burwell Williamson his heirs & assigns forever a certain Tract or parcel of Land containing
 One Hundred & twenty five acres more or less Situate Lying & being in the County of Southam
 pton Bounded as followeth Viz; Beginning at a Live oak at the head of a small Branch of a line Tree of
 John Harris and along Harris's line to a red Oak a corner Tree along the said line to a gum
 Thence to a pine so along the said line to a Live Oak a corner Tree of Thomas Hollimans at the head
 of Barbecue Branch & down the said Branch to a Live oak a corner tree of Joseph Williamson & land
