 This Indenture made this Thirteenth Day of March in the year of our Lord God one Thou-
 sand seven Hundred & fifty between James Taylor of Southampton County of the one part & Benj-
 Bynum of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Taylor for & in
 consideration of the sum of thirty pounds to him in hand paid by the said Benj. Bynum &
 the receipt whereof the said James Taylor doth bargain sell alien & confirm & by these
 presents doth bargain sell alien & forever confirm to the said Benj. Bynum a certain tract
 or parcel of Land specified in a patent granted to Thomas Taylor bearing date the twelfth day
 of July one Thousand seven Hundred & fifty containing four Hundred acres Lying & being in
 Southampton County & on the North side of Meherrin River & bounded as followeth (to wit)
 Beginning at a gum by the side of Tarrarro Creek a corner of Cordall Norfleets Land thence by the
 said Norfleets lines South seven ty Degrees west one Hundred & Sixty two poles to a pine &
 South west one Hundred & forty two poles to a white oak thence south forty Degrees East one
 Hundred & Twelve poles to a pine In Henry Dawson's line East Thirty one poles to a pine
 South seven ty five Degrees East seven ty six poles to a Live oak thence North seven ty seven
 Degrees East eight poles to white oak a corner of Thomas Pitmans Land by the side of the Long
 Pond thence by the said Pitmans lines North five Degrees West forty two poles to a small white
 oak North forty Degrees East Sixty four poles to a white oak & North seven ty five Degrees East
 Eighty six poles to a Lightwood stake a corner of Robert Bryants Land thence by the said Bryants
