

Anny This Indenture made this 12 day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and fifty between John Arrington one of the parish of Nettonway & County of Southampton of the one part & his son Benjⁿ Arrington of the parish of Albernarle & County of Sussex of the other part Witnesseth that for & in consideration of the natural Love & Affection which he hath & beareth unto the said Benjⁿ Arrington & for the better Maintenance of him the said Benjⁿ Arrington hath given granted Aliened confirmed & confirmed & Doth by these presents give grant Aliene^{in full} & confirm unto the said Benjⁿ Arrington his heirs & assigns three Slaves ~~to wit~~ a Wench Boy & Girl namely Hannah Windsor & Jude & the said John Arrington for himself his heirs & assigns Doth covenant promise & grant to and with the said Benjⁿ Arrington his heirs & assigns by these presents that the said Benjⁿ Arrington his heirs & assigns shall have good Right full power & Lawfull Authority to grant sell or ~~convey~~ the afore mentioned slaves & that the said Slaves is free & clear from other gifts grants Titles Powers wills In tails Judgments or Conditions & from all manner of Incumbrances whatsoever. Witnessing the same not only against myself my heirs & assigns but against all & every other person or persons whatsoever that shall or may claim any Right there to will warrant & forever Defend by these presents In Witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand & Affix my seal the day and year first above Written.

Kitchen This Indenture made the 11 day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and sixty James Hitcher of the County of Southampton of the one part & John Bowers of the other part of the same County Witnesseth that the said James Hitcher for & in consideration of the sum of thirty five pounds current money money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said John Bowers before the Sealing & Delivering hereof the receipt whereof the said James Hitcher Doth hereby acknowledged hath granted Bargained & sold & Doth by these presents grant Bargain & sell unto the said John Bowers his heirs or assigns a certain Tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton on the north side of black creek containing one Hundred & seventy five acres more or less the said Land beginning in the Caberis swamp at a poplar running to Thos Broadshaw line & by Broadshaw line to the murey Brand to a pine & running along of marked trees to the first Station which said sale the said James Hitcher hath forever Bargained sold & Delivered to the said John Bowers that he hath in himself good Right & Absolute power to make sale of the said Land & Doth hereby warrant the sale of the said Land to the said John Bowers for himself his heirs or assigns or any other person or persons laying any Right Title claim or pretence & that the said John Bowers his heirs or assigns shall & may from time to time & all times use occupy & enjoy the said Land without Interrupting of any person whatsoever In Witness whereof the said James Hitcher hereunto put his hand & Seal the Day and year above Written
