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This Indenture made this 10th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty six between Henry Jones and Margaret his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Thomas Patten of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Jones and Margaret his wife for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and ten dollars Current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Thomas Patten at or before the making & delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged William Langstaff Esq. and by these presents do and each of them do bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Patten his heirs & assigns a Certain tract or parcel of Land being and lying in the County of Southampton aforesaid and bounded follows on the south by the land of said Thomas Patten known by the name of the Gray Land on the East by the land of said Thomas Patten and Anne Patten known by the name of the Kitchen tract on the north by the land of George Garrison and on the west by the land of James Gardner of James Gardner dec. Containing seventy six acres be the same more or less being the land that I purchased of William Jones and that which was allotted to my wife Margaret in the division of her father's land embracing that parcel which alias the Wells lands have a downer right in of the seventy six acres together with all and singular the appurtenances whatsoever to the said land belonging or appertaining and the divisions & reversions remainders and annuities yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof and of every part & parcel thereof To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained & sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members & appurtenances unto the said Thomas Patten his heirs and assigns forever And the said Henry Jones & Margaret his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract or parcel of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Thomas Patten his heirs and assigns forever from the claim of them the said Henry Jones & Margaret his wife or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all & every other person or persons whatsoever shall well and do warrant and lawfully defend by them present or to come upon hereof the said Henry Jones and Margaret his wife have bound themselves & their heirs & assigns forever
