This Indenture made and entered into this 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 1828 between Benjamin Appletons of the County of Southampton of the first part John Mason of the said County of the second part and Thomas Appletons and Ruth Nicholson of the said County of the third part Whereas the said Thomas and Ruth are willing to be bound and assist the said Benjamin by becoming bound as his securitys in a bond or bonds hereafter to be given to one or more persons for a sum of money not exceeding two thousand four hundred dollars and whereas it is the intention & desire of the said Benjamin by means of the property herein after conveyed to provide for the entire maintenance & keeping of them his said securitys On this indenture witnesseth that the said Benjamin Appletons for and consideration of the premises as well as of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said John Mason before the sealing of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargains and sold unto the said Mason a certain tract or parcel of Land situated in the said County and lying on the stream called the Three Creeks containing by recent survey four hundred & eighty acres to be the same more or less as being the same tract of land lately purchased by the said Benjamin of his Brother Henry Appletons To have and to hold the said tract of Land with its appurtenances unto the said John Mason his heirs and assigns in fee simple forever upon trust nevertheless that the said tract and his assigns shall permit the said Benjamin & Appletons to remain in quiet possession of the said tract of Land and enjoy the same profits and emoluments arising therefrom as he may think proper until the said Benjamin Appletons and his securitys aforesaid shall have become liable to an action or actions on any of the said bonds above mentioned by reason of the said Benjamin failing to pay off any or all of the said sum of money of which they may be bound as aforesaid then the said John Mason his heirs or his assigns shall take possession of the said tract of Land & after duly advertising the time and place for doing any at least shall sell the premises herein Conveyed upon such terms as the said parties of the third part shall designate and the proceeds of such sale shall proceed to discharge their debts which shall remain untouched for the payment whereof the said Thomas Appletons and Ruth Nicholson shall be bound as securitys as aforesaid after paying the expenses of the same and the surplus of any shall pay over to the said Benjamin and Appletons or his assignee and the said Benjamin in for himself his heirs doch. covenant with the said John Mason & the parties of the third part that he will secure a good & perfect title to the
