the 29th day of May 1820 and recorded the 20th November 1820 also the deed made to said
Westbrook by Charles the Westbrooks the 29th day of May 1820 and recorded the 20th May 1821
also the deed made to said Westbrook by Nathaniel Foster the 29th September 1814 recorded
the 17th April 1815 also the tract of land lying on the three Creeks and bounded by the
lands of the Estate of Benjamin Lewis and Benjamin Applewhite containing two
hundred & six acres the same more or less, also one other tract of land lying in the
fork of the three Creeks and Holloway River and bounded by the said Creek & River
and the land belonging to the heirs of Robert Butler dec. containing one hundred & seventy
1/8 acres be the same more or less it being the tract of land the aforesaid Westbrook purchased
of Seth Michelson and Samuel Parham Compegnies reference to their deeds made the
said Westbrook the 23rd July 1822 and recorded the 17th February 1823 will more fully shew
to have and to hold the aforesaid tract of Land and all the appurtenances thereto belonging to
the said George P. Leary his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry S. Westbrook &
Rebecca F. his wife do by these presents Warrant and defend the titles to the aforesaid tracts
of Land unto the aforesaid George P. Leary and his heirs forever Witnesses whereof the

willingly signed sealed and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it Given

This Indenture made this 13th day of March 1826 by and between I Geo. Foster of South-
ampton County Virginia of the one part and Jacob Garden on behalf of the Baptist Church at
South Quay of the same County and State of the other part Witnesseth that whereas it is found
that the one acre of Land appropriated to the use and benefit of the Baptist Society & Church
at South Quay aforesaid by Deed of gift from Hollow Garden (the common predecessor of the
Land on which the South Quay meeting house now stands) is not sufficient for the use &
convenient accommodation of the said Baptist Church and Congregation who may meet from
time to time at that place for the purpose of carrying on the public worship of God
