This Indenture made this 13th day of August in the year 1824 Petronia Kitchum
Wife of the first part and Jacob Williams of the second part both of the said County of
Kinchum for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said Jacob
Williams at and before the sealing and delivery of them presents the receipt whereof is hereby
acknowledged and for the further consideration of securing to his wife Fanny and all the
children which he has by the said Fanny a support and maintenance in future independent
of the said Kinchum Kitchum hath by them presents given granted aliened sold delivered and conveyed
and doth hereby give grant bargain sell alien enfeof and Confirm unto the said Jacob
Williams and his Exors one certain tract of land lying in the County which the said
Kinchum acquired by his intermarriage with the said Fanny together with all the
appurtenances therunto belonging and the and Crops thereon growing except
the Crop of Cotton which is hereby reserved to the said Kinchum Kitchum together with
all and singular the stock of cattle sheep hogs and horses except one horse which is hereby
reserved to the said Kinchum Kitchum and all the plantation utensils now here of Kinchum
Kitchum one negro fellow named Sam and all his interest in a negro fellow named Jack
which the said Kinchum Kitchum hired for the present year still and all necessary apparatus
for making brandy To have and to hold the said granted premises and articles of property above
mentioned as well as such provisions as may now remain on the plantation at this time to
the said Jacob Williams his Exors and adm^r to the only proper use and behoof of them
the said Jacob Williams his Exors and adm^r notwithstanding upon this Special Trust & Condi-
-tion that the said Jacob Williams do suffer and permit the said Fanny to use occupy
and enjoy the same so long as she may live for the support of herself and all the children
of the said Kinchum Kitchum by her and at her death that each of the said children
as may be then living shall have the same Equally divided between them and the
said Kinchum Kitchum doth hereby Covenant and agree to warrant and defend
the above granted premises and articles of personal property to the said Jacob Will-
iams his Exors and adm^r against the claim of all persons whatsoever under by or
through him the said Kinchum Kitchum In testimony whereof the parties hereto have
