and doth hereby give grant bargains sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Jacob
Williams and his Excess one certain tract of land lying in this County which the said
Kinchin acquired by his inform arraige with the said Fanny together with all the
appurtenances therunto belonging and the
And Crop thereon growing except
the Crop of Cotton which is hereby reserved to the said Kinchin Sug together with
all and singular the Stock of Cattle sheep hogs and horses except One Horse which is hereby
reserved to the said Kinchin Sug and all the plantation utensils house hold & Kitchen
furniture one negro fellow named Jim and all his interest in a negro fellow named Jack
which the said Kinchin Sug had for the present year still and all necessary apparatus
for making brandy To have and to hold the said grants premises and articles of property above
mentioned as well as such provisions as may now remain on the plantation at this time to
the said Jacob Williams his Excess and ad'mt to the only proper use and behoof of him
the said Jacob Williams his Excess and ad'mt nevertheless upon this Special trust Whereas
- ever that the said Jacob Williams do suffer and permit the said Fanny to make occupy
and enjoy the same so long as she may live for the support of herself and all the children
of the said Kinchin Sug by her and at her death that such of the said Children
as may be then living shall have the same equally divided between them and the
said Kinchin Sug doth hereby Covenant and agree to warrant and defend
the above granted premises and articles of personal property to the said Jacob Williams
his Excess and ad'mt against the claim of all persons whatsoever suing by or
through him the said Kinchin Sug Interfamly whereof the parties herein have
