This Indenture made and entered into this 1st day of August in the Year of our Lord 1826
 Between William Prince of the first part Alexander T. Peete of the second part William Blom of the
 part all of the County of Southampton and State of New York Merchant that witnesseth the said
 William Prince stands freely indebted to the said Alexander T. Peete on his notes or Specie
 for the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars each and bearing equal date with these presents
 one payable on the 25th day of December 1827 and the other payable on the 25th Decemr. 1828
 and the said William Prince being willing by desirous to secure to the aforesaid
 Alexander T. Peete the payment of the two notes or Specie aforesaid amount to three
 hundred and fifty dollars each and also for the further Consideration of the sum of one
 dollar lawful money of New York to him the said William Prince in hand by the said William
 Blom paid the receipt whereof the said William Prince doth hereby acknowledge and know acquiesce
 and discharge the said William Blom from further payment on this behalf have given granted
 bargained & sold and do by these presents give grant bargain and sell unto the said William
 Blom his heirs and assigns forever the following three tracts pieces or parcels of Land
 to bring the same land which he the said Prince hath purchased from the said John
 by and bearing equal date with these presents and duly admitted to record in the Clerk's
 office of Southampton County one tract or piece of land known by Lot No 1 Containing
 by estimation seventy acres and bounded as by reference to adrs duly recorded in the County
 from John Prince to Alexander T. Peete well fully these Lot at 1 Containing Seventy
 acres and bounded as by adrs from Richardson Prince to the said Alexander T. Peete
 and duly recorded in the Clerks office reference being there has well fully shew and Lot No 3
 Containing Sixty acres the boundaries whereof will fully appear by reference to a deed
 from the said William Prince to said Alexander T. Peete duly recorded in the Clerks
 office of this County. To have and to hold the said Lots pieces or parcels of Land to
 1. 2. & 3 with the tenements hereditaments and all of singularly other the promised
 unto him the said William Blom his heirs and assigns forever and the said
 William Prince his heirs &c doth covenant and agree to and with the said William Blom
 his heirs and assigns forever to warrant and defend the right and title of the said
 Land against the claim or claims of all persons whomsoever upon first notwithstanding
 and upon this express proviso that if the said William Prince his heirs etc shall
 on or before the time the said notes or Specie shall become due and payable shall
 well and truly pay off & discharge the aforesaid Two notes or Specie aforesaid amount of three
 hundred and fifty dollars each to the said Alexander T. Peete his heirs &c when
 the same shall become payable which will be on the 25. December 1827 & 25 Decr 1828
 then this instrument and every thing herein contained is to become void and of no effect. Post of the 1st
 William Prince his heirs &c shall first to discharge the aforesaid two notes or Specie to
 the said Alexander T. Peete his heirs &c whenever the same shall become due or pay off
 thereof shall be the duty of the said William Blom his heirs and assigns
 at the request of the said Peete to set up at Public auction and sold to the highest
 bidder for ready money after giving at least ten days notice of the time & place of
 such sale the aforesaid pieces or lots of land lot 1. 2 & 3 and the money arising
 therefrom shall first pay and satisfy all expenses attending the execution of this
 bond and then discharge the aforesaid two notes to the said Alexander T. Peete
 amounting to three hundred & fifty dollars each as well the interest which may
 thereon lawfully have accrued and the balance then remaining shall pay over to
 the said William Prince his heirs and assigns the balance then remaining shall pay over to
 the said William Prince his heirs and assigns forever and to the said William Prince
 account what upon him these presents hath arisen of the parties hereto to be
