Justkins of the first part and Bird Harwell of the other part witnesseth that the said Gray J. Justkins &
William Justkins have for and consideration of the sum of two hundred and ten dollars in hand
paid by the said Bird Harwell the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and
by their premises do grant bargained and sell unto the said Bird Harwell a certain tract or parcel of Land
lying in the County of Southampton abiding that tract or parcel of land aforesaid to Jordan Justkins
orphan of Jordan Justkins deceased out of the tract called Lancaster Containing by estimation twenty nine
and a half acres better same more or less also one other tract aforesaid to George Washington deceased
orphan of Thomas Washington deceased in right of his mother Martha Washington deceased formerly
Martha Justkins out of the same tract Containing twenty three acres be the same more or less to him
and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with their appurtenances unto the said Bird
Harwell his heirs and assigns to the only proper use of him the said Bird Harwell
his heirs and assigns forever and the said Gray J. Justkins for himself and William
Justkins for himself and Samuel W. Justkins Jordan Justkins Cherry Justkins and
Henry D. Zimmerman in right do. Covenant and agree to and with the said Bird Harwell
