This Indenture made and entered into this third day of April in the year of our Lord 1824 between Gray I. Suddins for himself and William Suddins for himself an attorney in fact for Samuel W. Suddins Jordan Suddins Cherry Suddins and Henry D. Inman on the one part and Rebecca formerly Rebecca Suddins of the first part and Bird Harwell of the other part Witnesseth that the said Gray I. Suddins & William Suddins hath for and consideration of the sum of two hundred and ten dollars in hand paid by the said Bird Harwell the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Bird Harwell a certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton it being that tract or parcel of land assigned to Jordan Suddins orphan of Jordan Suddins dec'd out of the tract called Lancaster containing by estimation twenty nine and a half acres be the same more or less also one other tract assigned to George Washington dec'd orphan of Thomas Washington dec'd in right of his mother Martha Washington dec'd formerly Martha Ingham out of the same tract containing twenty three acres be the same more or less to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with their appurtenances unto the said Bird Harwell his heirs and assigns to the only proper use of him the said Bird Harwell his heirs and assigns forever and the said Gray I. Suddins for himself and William Suddins for himself and Samuel W. Suddins Jordan Suddins Cherry Suddins and Henry D. Inman might do. Covenant and agree to and with the said Bird Harwell that they the said Gray I. Suddins and William Suddins the title to the foregoing lands and premises unto the said Bird Harwell his heirs and assigns against the claim of themselves and their heirs and against the claim of all and every person and persons whatsoever claiming under the title of the aforesaid Samuel W. Suddins Jordan Suddins Cherry Suddins and Henry D. Inman shall and will in and out and forever defend by their presents In Witness whereof we the said Gray I. Suddins and William Suddins have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and Year first above written
