Peto of the said County and State of the third part Witnesseth that the said Giles Peto for and in consideration of the sum of one do. due to him in hand paid by the said Alexander P. Peto at and before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged as well as for the further Consideration of the sum of Eight hundred and fifty one dollars by bond payable 25th day of February 1826 from the said Giles Peto to the said Barham and the sum of about one hundred and fifty dollars the said sum being a balance due to the said Barham as Guardian of Frances Clements as also to secure the said Barham & Peto for their securitys ships to the said Giles in a bond executed by the said three last aforesaid parties unto a certain Joseph Helms for about nine hundred dollars and which said bond for greater Certainty may be referred to as also to save harm left and secure the said Edward Peto by reason of his responsibility as security of the said Giles in bond to the following persons to wit to Henry Burleys representatives to William Francis, Nathaniel Rockelle, John M. Burley, Lewis Morrell, Thomas J. Harper, D. Waller, Henry Linn, Spradley Williams, adj^{ts} of A. L. Williams, the estate of John Spencer, Sally Williams, Bailey Bryant, and also to such others as the said Edward Peto may or shall be responsible & bound for the said Giles and well as such other debts as may when adjustment and settlement be due to the said Barham as also for all other debts which the said Barham may be liable and bound for the said Giles. The said Giles hath doth hereby bargain & sell unto the said Alex^r P. Peto his said and adm^r the following property to wit Eight negroes (10) Hannah Cherry Archer baby broke Betty Anarcha and Sylvia four feather bed and furniture Horns Wood two horns all the plantation utensils and other house hold and kitchen furniture two boats and wheels Ten Hogs and all the stock of all kinds not necessary now to be particularly enumerated it being fully intended for the purpose before mentioned to convey all the personal estate of the said Giles Peto unto the said Alexander P. Peto. In Testimony whereof the said Alex^r Peto and it is the true intent and meaning of these presents that the said Alexander shall whenever he shall be required by the said Barham & Peto, to do after having given at least thirty days public notice in two or three of the most public places in the vicinage of the said property or such part thereof as shall or may be necessary for the payment of the said sum of money due to the said Barham or whenever the said Barham or Edward Peto shall have been compelled to pay for the said securitys bonds and any or either of the said sum of money before recited for each and after paying the said debts and all reasonable and necessary costs & charges attending this trust the balance pay to the said Giles Peto his heirs &c. or should the said Giles Peto die and pay the said debts and discharge the said Barham and Peto from their respective responsibilities and as security as aforesaid then the said Alexander when applied by such discharge satisfactorily to himself shall release the said Trust and the said Giles Peto to and for the purposes aforesaid with liberty Comant to and with the said Peto his heirs &c. to warrant & defend the title to all & every part of the before recited property against the Claim of himself and all other persons whatsoever Intestimony whereof the parties have hereunto set their Hand & Seal the day & Year first before written signed sealed & stuck in presence of
