This Indenture made this fifth day of August in the Year of our Lord 1826
between James Cooper of Southampton County of the one part and George P. Blow of Suffolk
County of the other part witnesseth that the said James Cooper for and in consideration
of the sum of four thousand and two dollars by the said George P. Blow is given in hand first of
the receipt whereof he the said James Cooper doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit
and discharge the said George P. Blow his executors and administrators. He hath granted
bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and Confirmed and by these presents doth grant barg
ain sell alien enfeoff and Confirm unto the said George P. Blow his heirs and assigns
one Certain Tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of
Southampton Containing by a late Survey of the Surveyor of said County Two hundred
and eighty acres be the same more or less and lying on the south side of Motturray
River the principal part of which say acres was divided by William Butts
the further to James Butts his son and the residue say acres was Convey
ed to the said James Butts by deed bearing date the

Making the entire tract which the said James Butts did Seize & possessed of
and which was sold and Conveyed to the said James Cooper under a decree
of Southampton County Court by Samuel Parham Parham Mann and
Benjamin Hines the Commissioners therein named to sell and Convey the
same by deed bearing date 31st March 1826 and duly recorded in the office of the
County Court of said County which said tract by said late Survey is bounded as
follows. First. Commencing at a Red oak on the River bank thence up along the
said bank to a red oak a corner of Mrs. Collier Chapman's and said land
thence along said Chapman's line S 82° 30' N 64° poles to an Elm thence S 88
W 18 poles to a white oak thence S 85 W 12 poles to a white oak thence E 87° 30' W
26 poles thence S 85 W 11 poles thence S 86 W 84 poles to a red oak thence S 74 W 18
to a white oak thence S 87° 30' W 33 poles to a Hickory thence S 63 W 36 poles to a corner
Maple in the Spring branch thence down the various Courses of said branch to a
Sweet gum thence S 87 W 28 poles to a black Jack oak thence S 15 W 11 pole 6 to a black
Jack oak thence S 12 E 24 poles to a black Jack oak thence S 17 E 59 poles to the
Racoon Swamp thence down the various Courses of said swamp to the beginning
and all wood waters profits and advantages whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of
land belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remain
ing and remainders rents issues and profits thereof and all the estate right title
interest property claim and demand whatsoever of him the said James Cooper
in and to the said tract or parcel of land belonging or in anywise appertaining
saving to the widow of the said James Butts that portion of said tract appertaining
to her as her dower by said Commissioners being Seventy acres during her natural life
the remainder as above Conveyed over to the said George P. Blow unfeoffed

To have and to hold the above named tract or parcel of land unto him the said
George P. Blow his heirs and assigns forever and the said James Cooper doth hereby
Covenant for himself and his heirs to and with the said George P. Blow his heirs &
assigns that the said tract or parcel of land hereby granted and sold unto him
the said George P. Blow and his heirs is free and clear of all encumbrances
whatsoever that he has good right full power and lawful authority to grant
sell and Convey the same that the above granted premises and every part & parts
thereof with their appurtenances now are and forever after shall be and remain unto
the said George P. Blow his heirs and assigns free and absolutely clear & discharge
of and from all former and other titles charges and encumbrances of what nature
and kind soever by the said James Cooper or any other person or persons whatsoever
and the said James Cooper for himself and his heirs will forever warrant & defend
