This Indenture made this 16th day of October in the Year of our Lord 1826 between
Henry Briggs and wife Sarah of the County of Southampton of the one part & Edward
Butts of the same County of the other part witnesseth that for and consideration of the
6 Butts sum of four hundred and thirty seven dollars and fifty cents lawful money of the
July 11th 1826 Commonwealth of Virginia to the said Henry Briggs and wife Sarah on hand paid by the said
Edward Butts at or before the ensinging and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged the said Henry Briggs and wife Sarah hath granted bargained
sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Edward Butts
his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the
County of Southampton and parish of St. Murray Containing Eighty seven and one half
acres to the same more or less it being that part of the tract of land which the said
Henry Briggs bought of John Cropper that lies between the Indian branch and
Seacory Road and bounded by the said Indian Branch the land formerly belonging
to Joseph Drury lies the land of Samuel Drury the said Seacory Road and the
land of Thomas Butts To have and to hold with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging
to the said Edward Butts his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry Briggs
and wife Sarah for themselves their heirs executors and adm'rs do the present and agree with
the said Edward Butts his heirs and assigns the right and title to the said tract
of Land they will warrant and forever defend Given under our hands & seals
