This Indenture made this twenty third day of November eighteen hundred & twenty six
 Between Edwin Gray of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part William
 Blount of the same County and State of the second part and John Urquhart Peter Boothe & James
 Rochelle John & Nicholas and all his the said Edwin Gray just Executors of the third part
 Witness this the 20th day of Decr 1826
 Wherefore that whereas the said Edwin Gray stands justly indebted unto the said John
 Urquhart by bond in the sum of Three hundred and seventy two dollars and fifty Cents bearing
 date the day of 1826 to the said Peter Boothe in the sum of Six hundred dollars more
 or less due by bond; to John & Nicholas the sum of about six hundred dollars due by bond &
 accounts to Thomas DeBrah the sum of Three hundred and seventy six dollars; and to Henry
 Briggs the sum of one hundred and twenty three dollars and fifty Cents to James Jackson
 by note the sum of one hundred and twenty eight dollars to James Pulliam the sum of one hund-
 red dollars due by note to William Allen the sum of ninety dollars and to James Rochelle
 the sum of Sixteen dollars due by account to General Robert Taylor the sum of Twenty dollars
 to John Mason the sum of Forty dollars to Augustine Claiborne the sum of one hundred
 and fifty dollars to William L. Everett the sum of twenty three dollars and fifty Cents
 due by note and whereas the said James Rochelle is security for the said Edwin Gray to a
 forthcoming or delivery bond executed by the said Edwin Gray and James Rochelle his security to
 Joseph Patton in the penalty of nine hundred and fifty one dollar and Eighty six Cents bearing
 date the tenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and Twenty six and whereas the said
 Edwin Gray is also indebted to Seth and Leving in the sum of one hundred and four dollars &
 twenty five Cents and to Edwards Butts the sum of thirty dollars money loaned also the amount
 of his the said Edwin Gray's taxes and sundry excursions. And the said Edwin Gray being
 willing and desirous to secure the payment of the aforesaid sums of money to the aforesaid persons
 to whom the same is due and being also desirous to secure the said James Rochelle from the
 payment of the aforesaid forthcoming bond to which he is security. Now this Indenture
 further witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid but more especially
 for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said William Blount
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents
 doth grant bargain sell unto the said William Blount his heirs executors and adm^r one certain
 tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and ninety six acres lying and being in the County
 of Southampton being the same tract or parcel of land wherein the said Edwin Gray resided which
 was conveyed to him by his Father Thomas Gray one half of one sixth of the Spring Swamp
 plantation lying in the County of Surfer which he the said Edwin Gray claims title to by descent
 also four negro Slaves Louis Dick Late Rachel and Anthony one hundred and fifty barrels of
 Corn two Copper stills one four and one two Barrells Capacity forty head of Hog two Cows of
 one Two head of Cattle all his the said Edwin Gray's plantation utensils of every description
 two Cider mills one hundred new Brandy Barrells a number of Casks five leather shoes and
 furniture two dozen Chairs Five Tables and all other household and kitchen furniture two ox
 carts two horse carts three horses five hinds two snoring one cow one mule one pair mule stined
 one set of two hoops and Coopers Tools one set Carpenters Tools one set Cabinet makers Tools all
 and every other article of property which the said Edwin Gray is now possessed of to have and to hold
 the aforesaid tract and piece of Land with its appurtenances therunto belonging and personal
 property to the said William Blount his heirs Exors & Adms^r Upon Trust that is to say the said
