 & William Blot Rochelle John Nicholson and all his the said Edwin Gray's just Creditors of the third part  
 unto this the 20<sup>th</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Inst whereas the said Edwin Gray stands justly indebted unto the said John  
 Arquhart by bond in the sum of Three hundred and seventy two dollars and fifty Cents bearing  
 date the day of 1826 to the said Peter Booth in the sum of six hundred dollars more  
 or less due by bond to John Nicholson the sum of about six hundred dollars due by bond &  
 accounts to Thomas. DeBatt the sum of Three hundred and seventy six dollars and to Henry  
 Bugs the sum of one hundred and thirty three dollars and fifty Cents to James Jackson  
 by note the sum of one hundred and twenty eight dollars to James Pitt and the sum of one hundred  
 dollars due by note to William Allen the sum of ninety dollars and to James Rochelle  
 the sum of Sixteen dollars due by account to General Robert Taylor the sum of Twenty dollars  
 to John V Mason the sum of Forty dollars to Augustine Chilborn the sum of one hundred  
 and fifty dollars to William L Evans the sum of twenty three dollars and fifty Cents  
 due by note and whereas the said James Rochelle is security for the said Edwin Gray to a  
 forthcoming or delivering bond executed by the said Edwin Gray and James Rochelle his security to  
 Joseph Pittman in the penalty of one hundred and fifty one dollars and Eighty six Cents bearing  
 date the tenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and forty six and whereas the said  
 Edwin Gray is also indebted to Shells and Peering in the sum of one hundred and four dollars &  
 thirty five Cents and to Edwards Butts the sum of thirty dollars money loaned also the amount  
 of his the said Edwin Gray's taxes and sundry executions. And the said Edwin Gray being  
 willing and desirous to secure the payment of the aforesaid sums of money to the aforesaid persons  
 to whom the same is due and being also desirous to secure the said James Rochelle from the  
 payment of the aforesaid forthcoming bond to which he is security. After this Indenture  
 further witnesseth that for and consideration of the promises aforesaid but more especially  
 for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said William Blot  
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents  
 doth grant bargain & sell unto the said William Blot his heirs executors and adm<sup>t</sup> done certain  
 tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and ninety six acres lying and being in the County  
 of Southampton being the same tract or parcel of land wherein the said Edwin Gray resided which  
 was conveyed to him by his Father Thomas Gray one half of one tenth of the Spring Swamp  
 plantation lying in the County of Sussex which by the said Edwin Gray claimed title to by descent  
 also four negro slaves named Dick, late Rachell and Anthony one hundred and fifty barrels of  
 Corn two Copper stills one four and one two barrels Capacity forty head of Hogs two Toke of  
 oxen Ten head of Cattle all his the said Edwin Gray's plantation utensils of every description  
 two Cider mills one hundred new Brandy barrels a number of Casks for leather hide and  
 furniture two dozen chairs Five tables and all other household goods and kitchen furniture two  
 carts two horse carts three horses five hams two Smoky m<sup>r</sup> Corn Crusher two pair mill Stones  
 one set of two hoes and Copper tools one set Carpenter tools one set Cabinet makers tools all  
 and every other article of property which the said Edwin Gray is now possessed of to have and to hold  
 the aforesaid tract and pieces of Land with its appurtenances thereunto belonging and personal  
 property to the said William Blot his executors and upon trust that is to say the said
