

William Blor shall at such time as he may be requested by any two of the aforesaid Creditors in writing or at the request of the said Edmon Gray his heirs Executors or admors expose all the aforesaid property to public sale for cash or on such credit as all the parties may agree on. first giving ten days notice of the time and place of sale by advertisement at as many public places as he the said William Blor may think advisable and out of the proceeds of such sale keep pay and satisfy the debt due by Forthcoming or delivering bond to Joseph Shelton to which said James Rochelle is security and out of the residue of the said sales pay to the aforesaid persons their respective debts with the interest thereon accruing and also pay to Robert Lloyd in thirty Eight dollars and to Rich^d Stephenson one hundred and twenty five dollars and the surplus of said sales pay over to the said Edmon Gray his heirs Executors & admors to his order, and the said Edmon Gray for himself his heirs Executors & admors well forever warrant and defend the right and title to the aforesaid property and every part & parcel thereof against the claim of him the said Edmon Gray and his heirs Executors & admors & against all and every person or persons whomsoever and the said Edmon Gray hereby covenants and agrees with the parties to these presents that the said William Blor shall at all times have full liberty and privilege to execute this Trust Indentment whereby the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day

This Indenture made this second day of November in the year of our Lord 1826 between Lewis Harris of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia as trustee to a deed of Trust executed by William Hland jr of the County and State aforesaid in favor of John Hland of County and State aforesaid duly recorded in the clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton County and State aforesaid of the other part (Witnesseth that the said Lewis Harris Trustee of the above named deed of Trust for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty dollars of lawful money of Virginia to him the said Lewis Harris Trustee in hand well and truly paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Lewis Harris Trustee hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said Edmon Hland his heirs and assigns all the right title and interest of the said William Hland jr in and to a tract of land lying in the County of Southampton formerly owned by John Phillips deceased together with all the meadows and appurtenances thereto belonging containing by estimation one hundred and twenty acres more or less It being the donor land and all the same to Nancy Hland formerly Nancy Phillips late widow of said John Phillips deceased wife of said William Hland jr from the estate of the said John Phillips deceased to have and to hold the said land meadows premises and appurtenances all & singular unto the said Edmon Hland his heirs and assigns to the only proper heirs and assigns of the said Edmon Hland his heirs and assigns forever and the said Lewis Harris as Trustee for himself and his heirs the said land meadows premises and appurtenances and every part thereof against him and his heirs assigns and all and every other person and persons whatsoever to the said Edmon Hland his heirs and assigns shall and well warrant and forever
