This Indenture made this 25th day of October in the year of our Lord 1826 between George H. Gray of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia on the one the one part and James Rochelle of the County and State aforesaid on the other part witnesseth that the said George H. Gray being desirous of securing the payment of a debt due to the estate of David Tallance bearing date the day of December 1824 of the sum of seventy five dollars for the payment of which Thomas H. Gray is bound as security also a debt due to Edw. Gray by note with Edwin Gray as security to the amount of one hundred and seventeen dollars bearing date the 15th day of May 1825 also a debt due to Edwin Gray of the sum of thirty six dollars and 50 cents also a debt due to the Estate of Amos. Ingersoll for the sum of \$ with Stephen Munday as security for and in consideration of the above mentioned premises and for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said James Rochelle the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said George H. Gray hath granted bargained and sold by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said James Rochelle all the property which the said George H. Gray is possessed of consisting of household furniture one horse one single leg two sets of harness one cart and wheels two Cows two Cattle two hogs a parcel of corn and fodder one hen and all other property of every kind which the said George H. Gray is possessed of at this time to have and to hold in trust for the purposes herein mentioned. The condition of these presents is such that if the above obligations be not discharged by the said Geo. Gray when demanded then the said James Rochelle shall cause the above mentioned property to be sold to public sale to the highest bidder after having advertised the time and place of sale according to law and out of the money arising from sale pay to the Representatives of David Tallance the amount due by the above mentioned bond and out of the remainder pay to Edwin Gray so much as may suffice to discharge the amount for which he is bound as security and the amount due from individual and out of the remainder pay to Stephen Munday so much as may discharge him from his obligation as security and out of the remainder so much as may indemnify him in case the property conveyed to him by a former deed should not be sufficient and the remainder pay to James Rochelle or so much as may be sufficient to discharge a debt due him by bond and the remainder if any pay to William E.
