This Indenture made this 26th day of May in the year of our Lord 1826 between John Forster of the first part Jonathan Bryant of the second part and Bailey Bryant of the third part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that whereas the said John Forster stands justly indebted to Jonathan Bryant by note for the sum of one hundred & twenty six dollars bearing equal date with these presents and whereas for the further assurance of the payment it is agreed by the parties hereto that a Conveyance in Trust shall be made to the said Bailey Bryant for the benefit of the said Jonathan Bryant of the said sum on the note aforesaid shall not be punctually paid with lawful interest thereon on or before the 26th day of January next ensuing & for. This Indenture witnesseth that the said John Forster for and in consideration of the premises and for the further sum of one dollar to him in hand paid the receipt of which is acknowledged has bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell and deliver unto the said Bailey Bryant his heirs & assigns one hundred and forty two acres of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton and bounded by the well known and reported boundaries to have and to hold the above granted and bargained premises with every of the appurtenances unto the said Bailey Bryant his heirs and assigns in Trust as Trust for ever and it is hereby declared to be the true intent and meaning of these presents that if the said John Forster shall punctually pay unto Jonathan Bryant his heirs or assigns the sum of one hundred & twenty six
