 of James and being in the County of Southampton it being the same Land which the said John Blythe the husband
 of Thomas Williams for himself as well as his brother George & William
 and which was devised to the said Thomas Williams and George & William by the last will & testam-
 ent of Jordan Williams their father which said last will and testament is duly recorded in the
 Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred twenty
 two acres and bounded by the Lands of the said James Rockelle Samuel Levert Robert Rockelle
 and Francis Levert to have and to hold the said Land with the tenements hereunto and all
 and singulars together the premises thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining to him
