 in consideration of the sum of Two hundred dollars to them now hand paid by the said James Rochelle  
 To James Rochelle before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted  
 bargained & sold aliened and delivered and by these presents doth grant bargain & alienation enjoin  
 the 16<sup>th</sup> day and Confess unto the said James Rochelle his heirs executors and assigns a certain tract of Land lying  
 and being in the County of Southampton it being the same Land which the said John Plythe the brother  
 of Thomas Williams for himself as well as his brother George & William  
 and which was devised to the said Thomas Williams and George & William by the last will & testam-  
 ent of Jordan Williams their father which said last will & testament is duly recorded in the  
 Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton containing by estimation one hundred twenty  
 two acres and bounded by the Lands of the said James Rochelle Samuel Leavitt Robert Leavitt  
 and Francis Leavitt to have and to hold the said Land with the tenements hereunto and all  
 and singulars together the premises thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining to him  
 the said James Rochelle his heirs executors and assigns and the said John Plythe and Elizabeth  
 his wife for themselves and their heirs doth hereby Covenant promise and agree to and  
 with the said James Rochelle his heirs executors & assigns to warrant and forever defend  
 all the right title interest in the said Land to him the said James Rochelle his
