This Indenture made this 24th day of December 1826 between James Ellis of the
first part Edwards Butts of the second part and and Michael Ellis of the third party
Whereas the said James Ellis stands justly indebted to John Thorpe admr of Jacob
Williams Mother between one hundred and forty and one hundred and fifty dollars
to John M. Guile and George Guile between thirty and forty dollars to Lew by
thirty three dollars sixty five Cents will interest and cost to Jno Dunning a/c of
James Stephenson thirty six dollars and ten Cents will interest and costs and to John
Myrick fifteen forty and fifty dollars which the said Michael Ellis stands bound
as his security which several debt will more fully appear by reference to the record of
this County and to the several persons who hold the bond. the said James Ellis willing
and desirous to have himself to the said Michael Ellis upon this Indenture witnesseth
that for and in consideration of the promises and also for the further Consideration of
the sum of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the said James Ellis when
paid by the said Edward Butts at and before the concluding and delivery of this instrument
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said James Ellis hath given granted
bargained & sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell & confirm to the
said Edward Butts and his heirs and assigns forever the following property
to wit one negro man named Jeffre and one other negro boy
named Joe their head of Cattle eight head of Hogs their feather bed and furniture
one Pork Case twelve books three Tables three Chest three head of Sheep four Trunks
one shot Gun one. Some two spinning wheels one Cup board few dishes two sets of
plates two Canali sticks seven chairs one set of knives two set of Cutlery India
spoon one pot two Spoons one oven one pair flat iron one pair and iron, shovel Tong
one Tea tray one bread water sixteen basins Three bowls one Coffeepot Eight baking tins
one Jug one plough Tines and gins three axes Grubbing hoe one dayes & 50s. plough
hors with all the right tools and interest of the said James Ellis in and to the aforesd
property. To have and to hold the said hereby conveyed unto the said Edward Butts his
heirs exec admr and assigns forever to the use, pro rata and behoof of the said
Edward Butts his heirs exec admr & assigns forever and the said James Ellis for
himself his heirs exec and admr. doth hereby covenant promised & agree to & with
the said Edward Butts his heirs exec admr & assigns forever in manner ofwth
using that is to say that the said James Ellis his heirs exec admr doth afterward
slavestate property hereby conveyed unto the said Edward Butts his heirs exec admr & assigns
against all persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and recover defend by the
present upon him or either of them that the said Edward Butts his heirs exec admr shall
at any time when the said Michael Ellis shall be in danger of paying the aforesd
debt and interest & costs or shall be required by the said Michael Ellis full the
aforesd property hereby conveyed to the highest bidder for and after advertising the
aforesd property at least Ten days at two or more publick places of the town an
place of sale and out of the money arising from the sale of the property or otherwise
pay the costs of the Indenture and all other Costs attending the sale & then the
debts as aforesd and interest & costs that may grow due thereon and the surplus
of any pay over to the said James Ellis of such person or persons as he may out
