This Indenture made the 1st day of September in the Year of our Lord 1826 between Giles Rees of County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part Edward Reed of the said County and State of the third part witnesseth that the said Giles Rees as well for the purpose of securing the payment of the several sums of money due Nathaniel Rochelle admr of Edward Turner for the rent of said Turner's plantation and also all the Crops made on the plantation wherein I now live to secure the said Edward Reed as *my* security for the said rent due 25th December 1825 for one hundred and fifty dollars yearly for five years making in all the sum of Seven hundred and fifty dollars ending on the 25th December 1829 and also secure the said Edward Reed against any loss or injury which he might sustain in consequence of being my Security for the said Nathaniel Rochelle as for the several sums of money as for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar to the said Giles Rees by the said Alexander P. Peete in hand paid at and before the ensinging and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged both bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain sell alienen enfeoff & Confirm unto the said Alexander P. Peete his heirs & assigns all the Crops made on the said plantation consisting of Corn Cotton Peas &c also all the Crops of Corn & Cotton made on the plantation wherein I now live. To have and to hold to the said Alexander P. Peete the above Crops of Corn & Cotton to his heirs and assigns forever. Nevertheless upon that Special Trust and Confidence and it is expressly agreed on by the parties hereto that the said Alexander P. Peete is as quick as the Crop can be got in by the owner of said Giles Rees and the said Edward Reed has been or adme shall after giving twenty days public notice of the time & place sell the Crop of Corn Cotton &c for ready money and out of the proceeds of the sales pay the several sums of money with the accruing interest which may then be due to said Nathaniel Rochelle his executors admr or any sum or sums of money which the said Edward Reed may be compelled to pay in consequence of the aforesaid Securityship for the said Giles Rees and the expenses attending the execution of this Trust and the surplus if any pay over to the said Giles Rees his heirs & admr and the said Giles Rees for himself his heirs executors & admr warrant & defend the right & title of the aforesaid Crops of all description to the said Alexander P.
