 Rochelle. Indenture

This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of May 1826
 between Thomas C. Jones of the one part James Rochelle of the second part
 and James M. Mapentburg of the third part. Whereas the aforesaid Thomas
 C. Jones has executed his certain promissory notes or obligations under seal to
 certain persons particularly to Samuel Brown as Representatives of St. Charles
 Clement Rochelle as Guardian to the orphan of Magd. Benjamin Buffum as
 Representatives of Joseph Hick Cloyd and Robert B. Taylor to all of which
 the said James M. Mapentburg is security, and the said Thomas C. Jones being
 to secure and indemnify the said James M. Mapentburg against any loss by reason of
 any such undertaking, obligation or suretyship as well as all & every other in
 which he may hereafter become bound & for and in consideration of moneys
 in hand paid by the said James Rochelle unto the said Thomas C. Jones he
 the said Thomas C. Jones hath given granted bargained sold and by these
 presents doth give grant bargain sell and convey release and Confirm unto the
 said James Rochelle the tract of Land whereon the said Thomas C. Jones
 now resides together with the reversion and reversions remainder & remainders
 & parts and other unto issues and profits and every part and parcel thereof
 also one negro woman late with her future increase the whole of his household
 hold and kitchen furniture To have and to hold said tract of Land negro
 woman and her increase and other personal property to him the said James Rochelle
 his heirs and assigns forever upon Trust nevertheless that the said James Rochelle
 shall at any time if requested sell so much of said property at public auction for
 such as may be necessary to indemnify said James M. Mapentburg against any
 loss which sustained or likely to be sustained by him or such person as may be
 necessary for the discharge of whole of said debts with interest & costs growing
 at least ten days notice previous of the time and place of sale and shall
 after the payment of said debts pay over to said Thomas C. Jones any
 surplus funds remaining in hand and release such part of said property
 as may remain unsold and should the said Thomas C. Jones fully & faithfully
 discharge the whole of said debts without loss or injury to said James M. Mapentburg
 then this indenture to be void
