the same as also the sum of one dollar in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
both bargained & sold unto the said McLennan one negro woman named Ball for the intent &
purpose of securing the aforesaid debts and that the said McLennan as Trustee shall at any time
when called on by the said Parkham cause said negro to public sale and with the money
arising first pay and the above debts with interest and costs and the surplus if any return

the Town of Suffolk and County of Staffordshire for and in consideration of the natural love and
affection which we bear to our mother Margaret P. Peale of the County of Southampton and for
the purpose of making some provision for her during her life or widowhood have given & granted
and by these presents do give and grant to the said Margaret P. Peale during the term of her
natural life or widowhood the use of a certain tract or parcel of Land with the tenements and
appurtenances thereto attached and belonging where the said Margaret P. Peale now
resides situate lying and being near the Croft Steys in the County of Southampton &
containing by estimation one hundred and thirty acres and the do also lend unto the said
Margaret P. Peale during her life or widowhood the following negro slaves to wit a
negro man named George a negro boy named John a negro woman named Hannah
and a small negro girl named Fleda together with the increase of the female
