To have and to hold the said sixty three acres of land with all & singular the appurtenances therunto belonging to the said Stuart Harris his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Stuart Harris his heirs and assigns forever and the said Byrd Lundy and Rebecca his wife then his executors and admors shall and lawfully and forever defend the above mentioned land and premises unto the said Stuart Harris his heirs and assigns forever against the claim or title of all person or persons whatsoever. This Indenture made the 15th day of January in the Year of our Lord 1827 Between Samuel Bailey of the County of Southampton of the one part and William O. Bailey of the County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Samuel Bailey for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to him here hand paid by the said William O. Bailey before the ensuing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Samuel Bailey doth hereby acknowledge thereof and of every part and parcel thereof well fully clearly and absolutely acquit exonerate and discharge the said William O. Bailey his heirs executors and assigns by these presents and for divers other good causes and considerations hereunto moving the said Samuel Bailey hath granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents for himself his heirs & successors do grant bargain & sell alien enfeoff & confirm unto William O. Bailey his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land containing one hundred acres more or less being part of a tract being a part of a tract of Land called the said Samuel Bailey by his father & Charles Bailey and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a maple in a Branch of any Hanes etc. thence up said branch
