W^m & Indenture made this 20th day of December 1825 between David Tallance and Catharine his wife
of the City of New York of the one part and Robert Gray of the Town of Jerusalem of the other part
Witnesseth that the said David Tallance and Catharine his wife for and in consideration of the
sum of twelve hundred dollars to them in hand paid or secured to be paid hath granted bargained &
sold altho under sealed and Confirmed unto the said Robert Gray his heirs and assigns forever a
certain lot of land lying situate and being in the Town of Jerusalem and County of Greenwich
and known and distinguished in the plan of the said Town of Jerusalem by Lot A. 5. & bounded as
follows. Beginning at the south east corner of Lot A. 4. on the west side of the main street
thence along the main street westerly but four inches to the Crop Street two hundred and thirty seven
feet more or less to the corner of which thence on the line of which westerly but four inches to the
corner of lot A. 4. thence binding on lot A. 4. two hundred and thirty one feet more or less
to the beginning ^{or part} also a part of a certain ^{lot} of land lying situate and being in the said Town of
Jerusalem and known and described in the plan of the said Town of Jerusalem by A. 6. and bounded
as follows. Beginning at the south west corner of lot A. 5. and the north side of Crop Street
thence along the line of A. 5. westerly but four inches to the corner of Lot A. 4. thence south
seventy six degrees west to a large pine standing near the river to the Crop Street thence along
the north side of the said street to the beginning with all houses out houses buildings
yards gardens together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or
in any wise appertaining and the reversions and reversions remainder and remainders
and all benefits issues and profits of the said land and promised and all its rights little
interest to the same to have and to hold the said lot A. 5. and the above described parcel
part of lots A. 6. and other promised unto the said Robert Gray his heirs and assigns
forever to the only proprie and behoof of him the said Robert Gray his heirs and assigns
and the said David Tallance and Catharine his wife their heirs & hereby Covenant &
agree to and with the said Robert Gray that they the said David Tallance & Catharine
his wife their heirs and assigns and every of them shall and will forever warrant &
defend the right and title in and to the said lot A. 5. and part or parcel of lot A. 6.
and every part and parcel thereof with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belong-
ing unto the said Robert Gray his heirs and assigns forever against the claim or demand
of them the said David Tallance and Catharine his wife their heirs and assigns forever
against the claim or demand of them the said David Tallance and Catharine his wife
their heirs and assigns and every other person whomsoever Interfere may whereof the
said David Tallance and Catharine his wife have herunto set their hands and affixes their seals
