to

This Indenture made this 5th day of October in the Year of our Lord 1826 Between Benjamin Harrison and his wife Catharine of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part and James Jackson of the aforesaid County and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Harrison & Catharine his wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and seven pence and six Cents to them in hand paid in or before the executing and delivery of these presents by the said James Jackson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted sold and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant sell convey enfeoff and confirm unto the said James Jackson his heirs & assigns one certain tract or parcel of land in the aforesaid County of Southampton and lying on the flat Swamp Containing by late survey 16 7/8 acres be the same more or less and bounded as followeth viz Beginning at or near a hickory stump fifty eight degrees east twenty poles to a small black gum near the run of the Swamp thence stretch 89 N. 28 poles thence S 74 1/2 W 9 1/2 poles to a pine in the Swamp thence S 4 E 4 1/2 poles to a pine near the said Jacksons new ground thence along the said Jacksons line to the beginning together with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining To have and to hold the above land and privileges unto the said James Jackson his heirs and assigns to his and their proper heirs and behoof forever and Mc Covenant with the said James Jackson his heirs and assigns that mean lawfully seized on fee of the premises that they are free from all incumbrances and that he will warrant and forever defend the same unto the said James Jackson his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims or demands of all persons whatever In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals the day and date above written signed sealed & delivered in presence of
