

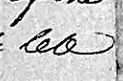

Know all men by these presents that I Thomas E. Holladay of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia have made ordained constituted and appointed and by these presents do make ordain constitute and appoint Joseph P. Whitehead my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name but to my use to ask demand sue for recover & receive all the lands named in the Military Books in the State of Ohio and Kentucky in the name of Thomas Edmund of Southampton County State of Virginia as Military lands and also the said Joseph P. Whitehead in my name and to my use to ask demand sue for recover and receive all and every such rents and arrears of rents as are now due and owing on the said land and for more payment of said rents and arrears of rents or any part thereof to enter and distrain and the distresses so taken to cause to be disposed according to Law and upon payment, discharge or arrears of rents, and receiving the said land placed upon the Military Books as aforesaid in the States aforesaid. And further him the said Joseph P. Whitehead for me and in my name but to my use to sell and dispose of at his own discretion all or any part of the aforesaid land so by him received lying as aforesaid in the States of Ohio & Kentucky; and for me and in my name to make a conveyance of the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof as fully and in every respect as if I were personally present and the purchase money rents & arrears of rent so by him received immediately thereupon to pay over to me or my representatives or to my order and further to do and execute all and every other lawful act & acts for receiving receiving and obtaining of the said rents or arrears of rents and of disposing of the land aforesaid: hereby ratifying & confirming all & whatsoever my said attorney shall in my name lawfully do or cause to be done in and about the premises by virtue of these presents In witness whereof I the said Thomas E.
