 hundred and twenty seven between Charles G. Gold and Elizabeth his wife of the County of
 Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Benjamin Griffin of the same County
 and State of the second part and James Horton of the County of Warren and State of
 Ohio of the third part: Whereas the said Charles G. Gold is justly indebted to the said
 Horton in the sum of one hundred and seventy two Dollars & 42 Cents to be paid on the first
 of March next as by a bond bearing date with these presents more fully appears which is
 the 17th day of March 1829. Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and also for the
 Consideration of one Dollar to the said Charles G. Gold in hand paid by the said Benjamin
 at or before the making and receiving of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 by the said Charles G. Gold and Elizabeth his wife both given granted bargained sold alien
 released & confirmed & by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien release
 to the said Benjamin Griffin his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of Land
 and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton containing seventy two three fourths
 Acres which the said Charles G. Gold purchased of the heirs of Henry Butler together with the
 which Elizabeth his wife inherited from her late father Henry Butler also 100 Acres of
 Lumber one Shear one Cow three Yearlings one pig and hogs one Lamb and one
 One large Copper Kettle with all and singular Appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of
 Land belonging or in any wise appurtenant and all the Estate right title & interest
 which Charles G. Gold & Elizabeth his wife in & to the Land granted or intended to be hereby
 tract or parcel of Land and premises to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land
 intended to be truly granted tract or parcel of Land and premises together with the aforesaid property
