This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of June 1827 between James Newsum of the County of Southampton of the first part and William B. Lawrence of the second part Witnesseth
 that the said James Newsum for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars to him in
 hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold conveyed
 and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and convey unto the said William B. Lawrence his heirs
 and assigns two certain tracts or parcels of Land situate in the said County and lying near the
 stream called the Three Creeks containing Sixty Nine Acres be the same more or less as well fully appa-
 ring upon reference to the deed of John V. Mason & Wife to the said Newsum bearing date on the 17th Decr
 1825) also one other tract or parcel of Land adjoining the above containing 34 Acres which was
 purchased by the said Newsum of Henry Barron as will appear by reference to deed from said
 Barron to said Newsum bearing date on the 21st day of March 1826 also one other tract or parcel
 of Land adjoining the above containing 46 Acres which was purchased by the said Newsum of Richard
 Barron as will appear by reference to deed bearing date on day of 1826 from the said Richard Barron
 to the said Newsum. To Have and to hold the said premises with all and singular the
 appurtenances unto him the said William B. Lawrence his heirs and assigns forever and the said
 James Newsum doth covenant with the said Lawrence to all and every and forever secured to
 him his heirs and assigns a good and perfect title in all the premises aforesaid. In Testimo-
