This Indenture made this 20th day of March 1827 Between Benjⁿ Harrison of the County of Southampton of the one part Henry Moore and John Thorp of the second part and John Thorp of the third part. Witnesseth that whereas the said John Thorp and Henry Moore have this day become security or special bail for the said Benjamin Harrison as the suit of Wright Allen of Middlesex who sues for the benefit of the said Rules and the said Benjamin Harrison being willing and desirous to save himself from all damage or trouble which may be likely to sustain in consequence of their becoming his bail as aforesaid both for consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid granted bargain and sale by these presents give grant bargain and sell unto the said John Thorp and Henry Moore mutually chosen as trustees one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation two hundred and thirty or thereabouts to the same more or less and bounded as follows (To Wit) by the lands of Benjamin Davis Messers and the lands of said Benjⁿ Harrison Thomas Lees and Thomas Harrison reference being had to the deed from Richard Harrison of the boundaries thereof as more fully appear and known by the name of Easter Pond plantation. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract of Land with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto him the said John Thorp and Henry Moore upon this express condition that should the said Benjamin Harrison refuse to pay or delay in paying any of the debt upon which he is bound so that the said John Thorp and Henry Moore or either of them should suffer or be likely to suffer damages or to sustain any injury or put to any trouble in consequence of their becoming security or special bail as aforesaid that then it shall be lawful and it is the true intent and meaning of the parties for him the said John Thorp and Henry Moore upon request of either of the parties after giving at least fifteen days notice the time and place of sale advertise and sell for cash the aforesaid tract of Land out of the proceeds of said first pay and satisfy the said John Thorp and Henry Moore the full amount which they may have paid or that which they may be bound to pay by reason of the security and undertaking as aforesaid as well as all other reasonable charges incident to these presents and the balance of any pay on to him Benjamin Harrison or his heirs or assigns or any other person legally authorized to receive same and the said John Thorp and Henry Moore agree that should the said Harrison pay the debt and ^{be} ~~not~~ attending the same so that the said Moore or Thorp may be completely exonerated and discharged from the security and undertaking as aforesaid he will release unto the said Benjamin Harrison or his assigns the aforesaid tract of Land.
