This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of May 1827 between William Williams of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the second part and Edward Butler of the third part all of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of fifty Dollars hereunto paid by the said George Boothe the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said William Williams hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth sell and sell to the said George Boothe his heirs and assigns forever a certain Negro Male Mason which said negro Girl Sparrow and defend against all persons claiming or to claim from under me be it therefore remembered that the said Negro Girl is second to the said E Butler to secure George Boothe for the sum of fifty Dollars to be paid to the said E Butler for George Boothe on or before October Southamptn County Court next term in that case the said Negro Girl to be released to the said William Williams and in case he the said Williams shall fail to pay to E Butler for George Boothe the above named sum of fifty Dollars then and in that case he the Butler shall have to sell the aforesaid negro to pay the before said sum of money and all costs may attend the same. And out of the sales pay to George Boothe the sum of fifty Dollars and the residue after paying all costs to pay to said William Williams as Witness our hands and seals this 21st day of May 1827

This Indenture made and entered into this 21st day of May one Thousand Eight hundred and twenty ^{sevent} between Francis Clements of Southampton County of the first part and John Reese of Granville County of the second part, and John Reese of Granville County of the state of Virginia the third part. Witnesseth that the said Francis Clements for consideration of the sum of one Dollar to him in hand paid by the said John Reese receipt whereof he the said Clements doth hereby acknowledge and for other purposes hereafter named hath granted bargained & sold & by these presents doth grant bargain and confirm unto the said J. Reese his heirs and assigns the following negro to wit: John Cooper & Colaturn which negroes the said Clements doth hereby warrant his heirs assigns and himself to warrant and defend the right title and of the same unto the said J. Reese his heirs or assigns clear of all claims or demands and every person whatsoever notwithstanding upon trust to secure the payment of said debt he the said Clements acknowledges to be justly due to John Reese his heirs assigns & decisions to pay the said Debt of four thousand & twenty five Dollars and seventy eight cents. Now if the said Clements shall pay or cause to be paid unto said John Reese his debt as aforesaid together with all interests accruing thereon of carrying this conveyance into execution on or before 1st October next then this obligation to be void and of no effect: otherwise to remain in full force and effect as to authorize the said J. Reese to advertise and sell after giving his advertisement the above named property for ready money & pay over to the said Reese the proceeds of such sale after reserving to himself the usual commissions for carrying out as said debt & Int. may amount to if enough & if a balance should be due to pay such balance over to the said Clements or his lawful representatives in writing the parties herunto mutually agree once consent.
