

This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of July in the year of our Lord 1827 between Charles W Goodwyn and Narcissa his wife of the one part and Thomas S Harper of the County of Southampton of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Charles W Goodwyn and Narcissa his wife for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five hundred and eighty dollars lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Thomas S Harper at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Thomas S Harper his heirs and assigns the plantation on which the said Charles W Goodwyn and Narcissa his wife now live Commonly known and designated by the name of Croft Keys together with all and singlly the appurtenances belonging or appertaining to the said tract of land and the several tracts attached thereto and the remainder or remainders thereof and unto the heirs and assigns of every part or parcel thereof To Have and to hold the said hereby granted lands and tenements and the several tracts attached thereto and every part or parcel thereof to the only proper use and behoof of the said Thomas S Harper his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Charles W Goodwyn and Narcissa his wife shall and lawfully warrant and defend the right and title of the said tract or parcel of land and its appurtenances and the several tracts attached thereto and their appurtenances unto the said Thomas S Harper his heirs and assigns forever. Barley Pond

This Indenture made and entered into this thirty first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven by and between Samuel Bailey of the County of Southampton of the first part and Patrick Pond of the said County of the second part. Witnesseth that the said Samuel Bailey in consideration of thirty four pounds seven shillings and two pence with interest thereon from the eleventh day of November in the year 1815 and lawful money of this Commonwealth to him in hand paid by the said Patrick Pond at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) has bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Patrick Pond his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation two hundred and sixty eight acres and on which the said Samuel now resides being the whole of the tract of land devised to the said Samuel by the will of his father Charles Bailey dec'd except one hundred acres before granted by the said Samuel to his son William O Bailey by and duly entered into and recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County together with the houses outbuildings or barns and other appurtenances situated on the said tract or parcel of land belonging or appertaining to him and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances unto the said Patrick Pond his heirs and assigns forever
