This Indenture made and entered into this
 day of April one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven
 between James Norwiche of the County of Southampton of the one part
 and Sally Turner of the other part to the effect that whereas it is
 the desire of the said James Norwiche and Sally to be by the permission of God solemnized in marriage
 and whereas it has been agreed by and between the said James and Sally that after the marriage
 shall be celebrated of the said Parties one to exercise any claim by reason of the marriage
 on any part of the property of any kind or description which belongs and is or may be
 or may hereafter be to the said parties except so far as the same might be necessary
 to the comfortable maintenance and support of the parties during the continuance
 of the death of either that the survivor will not by claim or title to the property of
 the one thus dying but that the same shall go if there be issue of the marriage to such
 in case there should be no issue to such person or should be designated by the last will and
 Testament of the said decedent the right of making of which said will and Testament
 agreed shall after the said marriage be and remain unto the said Sally as fully and as
 as she could or might have exercised the same if she had been living at the time of the said
 consideration of the premises aforesaid doth agree & hereby covenants & binds herself to give
 to the said Sally her right to the full and perfect disposition of all and every part of the
 of every kind or description aforesaid according to the before noted agreement
 disclaiming any other further rights & privileges once stated in said before noted contract
 the said Sally on her part doth also covenant to agree to & with the said James that she
 in the event of his death not claim or exercise any title by virtue of the said marriage
 any part of the property of him the said James except only so far as before recited for the
 maintenance and support of the parties & their issue if any of such contemplation
 marriage during the continuance of the said further matrimony. It is further stipulated & agreed that the
 property of them both shall not be subject to the debts or contracts of the other already
 existing or to be made in future but that the proceeds of the property of each shall be a fund for
 the support of the parties & their issue during their joint lives & subject to disposition by
 such person or persons as the said parties may appoint & in the want of a failure to make
 such will or Testament that the property of either thus dying shall descend to his or her
 kindred as by Law the same would be by the Statute of intestacy in Virginia had he or she
 such marriage have been solemnized between the parties. And in Testimony whereof the

 Elizabeth Barnes and Eliza Balamor were also introduced as witnesses who being first
 sworn and say that the said contract was executed by the parties before the solemnizing
 the marriage between the said James B. Norwiche and Sally Turner whereof
 said contract is accord to be recorded
