This Indenture made and entered into the 21st day of May one thousand eight hundred & twenty
 seven between Giles Reed John Barham & Edward Reed of the County of Southampton of the
 first part and Robert Goodwyn of the said County of the second part. Whereas the said Giles
 Reed by and every incumbrance and of record in the Clerk's Office of the said County of Southampton
 convey certain negro slaves five in number to James Rochelle as Trustee to secure the pay-
 ment of a sum of money to the said Robert Goodwyn all which with more fully appear
 by reference to the said deed and whereas the said Giles Reed and the said John
 Barham and Edward Reed his creditors are desirous that the debt due to the said Good-
 wyn should be now paid so that the release of the negroes aforesaid may be applied to the payment
 of their demands against the said Giles Reed This Indenture Witnesseth that the said
 Giles Reed John Barham and the said Edward Reed jointly and singularly in considera-
 tion that the said Goodwyn will release his title to the other three negroes aforesaid do hereby
 bargain and sell unto him the said Robert Goodwyn in absolute property the two negroes
 Lewis and Ned to him his heirs and assigns forever and the said Giles Reed Edward and
