This Indenture made and entered into this 18th day of September 1827 between Henry Barrow of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and George G. Gentry of the same County and State of the second part and Jordan Barrow of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina of the third part Witnesseth that whereas the said Henry Barrow stands jointly indebted to the said Jordan Barrow in the sum of five hundred and twenty dollars 17/100 by his Bond bearing even date with this, and being willing and desirous to secure the payment thereof for and in consideration of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said George G. Gentry the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by this do grant bargain and sell unto the said George G. Gentry the following property to wit: One negro named Step Frank and Jack unto the said George G. Gentry his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry Barrow himself his heirs and assigns do forever warrant and defend the right of the said property herein named against the claims or demands of every person what soon upon Trust notwithstanding that the said George G. Gentry shall and may at any time after the 15th day of December next by request of either of the parties first giving him days previous notice sell at public sale for ready money the property herein mentioned and out of the proceeds of such sale pay unto the said Jordan Barrow the above named sum of with lawful interest from this date and all other charges & cost that may accrue hereby and the payment of any pay unto the said Henry Barrow his heirs or assigns for witness whereof the parties have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals this day and date before written

This Indenture made this 3rd day of October 1827 between Robert Goodwyn and James Rochelle of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and William Eversett of the same County and State of the other part Witnesseth that whereas the said William Eversett did on the 22nd day of January 1827 execute and seal a Trust to James Rochelle to secure a debt due Robert Goodwyn therein conveyed to the said James Rochelle Trustee one negro & girl aged one negro man Andrew and all his the said Eversett household and kitchen furniture cups of Corn and Brandly which he may make this present year referred to the said debt in Trust the same will more fully appear and the said William Eversett having in part paid to the said Goodwyn the debt aforesaid now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid the said Robert Goodwyn & James Rochelle for themselves their heirs & assigns do by these presents release and forever quit claim to the said household & kitchen furniture and to and as aforesaid unto him the said William Eversett his heirs and assigns forever.
