This Indenture made this 5th day of Oct. 1827 Between William L. Everett of the first part and Robert Gordon of the second part both of the County of Southampton Virginia. Witnesseth that whereas the said Robert Gordon did by his deed of conveyance the 20th of July 1826 demise ground and to form let unto the said William L. Everett a lot or lots in the town of Jerusalem known and distinguished in the plan of the town of Jerusalem by lot 20 together with a tract of land lying and being within a short distance from the same containing covenants in the said deed of lease particularly mentioned reference being had to the same will more fully appear and whereas the said William L. Everett hath this day mutually agreed that the lease or contract of lease for this day be utterly and entirely void Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for consideration of the premises but more especially for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him the said William L. Everett in hand paid hath remised and forever quit claim to the above remised and leased premises as expressed in the said deed of lease from the said Robert Gordon to the said William L. Everett the therein contained and the said William L. Everett for himself his heirs and assigns will forever warrant and defend the right and title of in and to the said leased premises & every thing contained in the said deed of lease as aforesaid Or Witnesseth that the said William L. Everett hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the day & year first aforesaid

This Indenture made and entered into this 6th day of Oct. 1827 Between Benjamin Harrison of the first part William L. Everett of the second part and Alexander P. Pico and Robert T. Musgrave of the third part all of the County of Southampton Virginia. Witnesseth that whereas the said Alexander P. Pico became owing to Benjamin Harrison in a forth coming or delivery bond executed on the day of and made payable to John Tamm executor of Jesse R. Croft who was administrator of Henry Harris the amount whereof may be seen by reference to the said bond filed in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County Court and the said Benjamin Harrison is also indebted to the said Robert T. Musgrave in the sum of fifty one dollars as he has also with these presents. And the said Benjamin Harrison being desirous to secure and save himself the said Alexander P. Pico from any and all claims or consequences of his becoming his security as aforesaid and also to save to the said Robert T. Musgrave the payment of the aforesaid sum of fifty one dollars as above said hath conveyed the property herein after mentioned to the said L. Everett in trust to be sold for that purpose Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Benjamin Harrison for and in consideration of the premises aforesaid for the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him by the said William L. Everett in hand paid the receipt whereof is truly acknowledged by the said Benjamin Harrison hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant sell convey & confirm unto the said Wm L. Everett his heirs and assigns all that parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and on which the said Benjamin Harrison resides containing two hundred acres be the same more or less Adams one parcel & one day of a day of a day and to hold the said parcel of land unto him the said William L. Everett his heirs and assigns forever the said Benjamin Harrison nevertheless it shall and may be lawful for the said Benjamin Harrison
