This Indenture made and executed this day of Oct^r in the year of
 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven between
 Middleton as Trustee of the one part and Henry Biddle of the third party
 all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that
 whereas by deed in Trust executed by the said Henry Biddle to the said
 Aubin Middleton as Trustee for the benefit of Thomas Flood bearing on
 the 15th of June 1825 and duly recorded in the County Court of Southampton
 on the same day by which is conveyed certain property to wit. Sixty acres of
 land be the same more or less situated in the aforesaid County and placed called
 Guinea Town also one other tract containing forty three acres of land bounded
 by the well known bounds the lands of Henry Biddle the lands of Francis Noble
 son formerly Biddle the lands of Henry Biddle the lands of Editha St. John the
 lands of Benjamin Biddle and the lands of Peter Edwards also all of
 this right with interest claim and demand in the lands of plantations which
 his Grandfather Biddle seized and possessed of and now in the possession of
 his Grandmother Lucy Biddle after first paying and satisfying the demand of
 Peter Edwards. do whom the two last pieces parts and Tracts of Land is conveyed
 in Trust as per bill of conveyance recorded in the County aforesaid on the 20th Sept^r
 1824 to secure and save harmless the said Thomas Flood from certain judgments
