Chitty of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part George
W. Powell of Southampton County & State of North Carolina of the second part and Lewis
Worrell of Southampton County and State of Virginia of the third part. Witnesseth
that whereas the said Dixon Chitty stands justly indebted unto George W. Powell in
the sum of Fifty Two Dollars and ninety two Cents by his bond bearing even date
with these presents and the said Dixon Chitty being willing and desirous to secure the
payment of the said debt unto the said George W. Powell his heirs Executors or admors
hath for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar to him in hand paid by the said
Lewis Worrell the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged doth grant bargain and sell
and by these presents hath granted bargained and sold unto him the said Lewis Worrell
and his heirs the following named Property to wit Eight head of Cattle one Horse
bridle and saddle and Ten head of Sheep one Cart and Cart wheels and one safe to and
for the following intents and purposes that is to say that the said Lewis Worrell may
and shall at any time after the fifteenth day of December next being requested by
either of the parties make sale of all the above named property by first giving ten days
previous public notice of the time and place of such sale for cash or so much thereof
as will pay and satisfy the above debt and out of the proceeds of such sale pay unto
him the said George W. Powell the aforesaid debt and interest thereon according
also all costs attending the execution of these presents and the overplus of any pay unto
