

This Indenture made this 26th day of December in the 4th year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and twenty seven between Richard Barron of the County of South-
 ampton one of the first part and Joseph Elward of the County of South-
 ampton one of the second part Witnesseth that the said Richard Barron for and in consideration
 of the sum of Nine Thousand three hundred and sixty Dollars of good and lawful money
 of Virginia then in hand paid by the said Joseph Elward at or before the making
 and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said
 Richard Barron and that he the said Richard Barron have bargained and sold and by
 one certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in the County of Southampten
 and adjoining the lands of Henry Barron on the west and on the South by the Carolina
 Swamp and on the East and North by the mill Pond now owned by Henry Barron
 containing eight hundred and forty acres more or less it being the land which the said
 Richard Barron at present resides also one other tract or parcel of land lying and being
 in the County of Southampten and adjoining the lands of William Elward on the
 west and North and Charles W. Goddard on the East and Henry Barron on the South containing forty four acres more or less
 it being my proportion of a tract of land known by the name of the Blake land which
 land was divided between the offspring of Henry Barron and I do hereby and do hereby
 in a deed of trust or parcels of land together with all the appurtenances belonging in
 anywise appertaining and all its privileges to and for the only proper use of him
 the said Joseph Elward his heirs and assigns forever and he the said Richard Barron
 doth for himself and his heirs hereby convey the said tracts or parcels of land with all and
 singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Joseph Elward
 his heirs and assigns forever free from the claims or claims of him the said Richard
 Barron and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever and he the said Richard
 Barron agree and perfect title to the same doth hereby warrant and will forever defend
 unto the said Joseph Elward his heirs and assigns forever In witness whereof
 the said Richard Barron have hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this day
 and year above written

Joseph Elward

This Indenture made and entered into this 3rd day of January 1828 between the Henry
 Barron of the first part Lewis Harris of the second part and James Rochelle of the third part
 Witnesseth that whereas the said Henry Barron stands jointly indebted unto the said
 Lewis Harris in the sum of nine hundred and five dollars and by him specially leaving
 date the 1st of August 1827 and being willing and desirous to secure the payment of the
 same hath conveyed the property herein after mentioned unto the said James Rochelle
 in trust to be sold for that purpose and he the said Henry Barron doth hereby
 do hereby and do hereby in consideration of the premises aforesaid and also for
 the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said
 James Rochelle the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given granted bargained
 and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell and convey unto him
 the said James Rochelle his heirs and assigns forever that certain tract or parcel of land
 to wit one tract or parcel of land which was divided between the said Henry Barron
 and my Grandfather John Barron lying in the same tract or parcel of land
 owned by the said Henry Barron and my Grandfather John Barron and he the said Henry Barron
