This Indenture made and executed this twelfth day of January in the Year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight between Henry Barron of the
County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and John Edwards
and Subira Middleton of the County and State aforesaid of the second part and
George G. Gurley of the County and State aforesaid of the third part Witnesseth
that whereas the said Edwards and Middleton of the second part have become heavily
indebted to the said Barron of the first part in a bond bearing date the twentieth of Decr. 1827
amounting to one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight dollars and twenty nine cents and made payable in money
the said Barron of the first part being willing and desirous to secure the said Edwards &
Middleton of the second part with some named securities from all damages payments
money or other injury or inconvenience hath consented to convey to George G. Gurley of
the third part who mutually & by consent of all parties is chosen as Trustee and
certain tracts or parcels of land on which the said Barron of the first part now
resides lying and being in the County and State aforesaid containing eight hundred &
fifty acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows on the north by the land of
Joseph T. Land lately purchased of Richard Barron on the East by the land of said
Joseph T. Land and the land of the said John Edwards South by land of Edward
Murphy and west by the land of Howell Harris and Wm. Land & is together with
the above named land the said Henry Barron of the first part consents to convey
unto the said George G. Gurley of the third part as trustee the following negro male
servant a negro man named Alfred and a negro woman named Maria
and a negro girl named Bona. 1828 This Indenture further Witnesseth
that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to the said Barron of the first part
