

Commissioners *To* *Bishop* *Examb. & Del.* *Henry Bishop* *Aug. 1st 1828*

This Indenture made this 22nd day of November in the 2nd year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty seven Between Turner Arrows & John Hargrave Commissioners appointed by a Decree of the Worshipful Court of Southampton (dated 2nd January 1827) to make sale of a tract of land of which Richard St. John did seize and possessed which descended to him by the death of his mother & which said tract or parcel of land was sold by the Commissioners aforesaid in pursuance of the sum aforesaid and Henry Bishop became the purchaser for the sum of two hundred and fifty six dollars and this Indenture therefore testifieth that the Commissioners aforesaid for and in consideration of the aforesaid sum of Two Hundred and fifty six dollars to them in hand paid or secured to be paid by the said Henry Bishop at before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain & sell unto the said Henry Bishop and his heirs the aforesaid tract or parcel of land containing by estimation Ninety Eight and three quarters acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at a white oak standing in the Arthur Swamp a corner for said Henry Bishop in Thomas P. Morrell's line thence along said Bishop's line to Sally Johnson's line thence her line to a black gum standing in the said Arthur Swamp thence down the various courses of the sum of said swamp to the beginning. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances thence belonging to him the said Henry Bishop and his heirs forever and the said Turner Arrows and John Hargrave Commissioners as aforesaid their and each of their heirs Executors admors. of the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances unto him the said Henry Bishop his heirs and assigns; shall & will by these Presents warrant and forever defend In Witness whereof we have hereto set our hands and affixed our seals in the year above writ.

Calvert & Co. *To* *Calvert*

This Indenture made this 5th day of January AD 1828 Between Matt Calvert of the one part and Samuel Calvert of the second part both of the County of Southampton & State of North Carolina. Whereas a certain Richard Duck by his Indenture made and admitted to record in the Court of Southampton County did grant transfer and convey unto the said Matt Calvert his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton together with the appurtenances thereto belonging in Trust. & with power and authority to the said Matt Calvert his heirs or assigns to sell and dispose of the said land so much thereof as might be necessary for certain purposes in said deed of Trust expressed and whereas the said Matt Calvert in execution of said Trust the true place and terms of sale having been twenty days previous thereto advertised express to sale for ready money the said Matt Calvert did sell the said tract of land containing one tenth acre at which sale the said Samuel Calvert became the purchaser thereof for the sum of Two Hundred Dollars And this Indenture testifieth that for and in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars by the said Samuel Calvert in hand paid to the said Matt Calvert his heirs and assigns
