This Indenture made this 14th day of December eighteen hundred and twenty seven
by and between Septimius Darden of Southampton County Virginia of the first part
Uriah Rawls of Hanover County and Jacob M. Duck of Isle of Wight County Executors
of Jacob Darden dec^d of the second part and Alfred Darden of the County of Southampton
aforesaid of the third part. Wherefore that the said Septimius Darden in order to receive
a debt due and owing from him to the said Jacob Darden dec^d as Guardian for Seth
and Jacob Williams as appears by a certain note sealed executed by him the said
Septimius Darden to Jacob Darden Guardian aforesaid bearing date the twenty fourth day of
January eighteen hundred and twenty four for the sum of seven hundred and seventy
one dollars and thirty nine cents payable on or before the first day of January eighteen
hundred and twenty five and for the further consideration of one Dollar to him the
said Septimius Darden in hand paid by the said Alfred Darden at and before the creating
and delivery of these presents the said Septimius Darden hath granted bargained sold aliened
and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto him
the said Alfred Darden his heirs and assigns forever two negroes to wit and Jack To
have and to hold the said bargained premises with all one singular the appurtenances
profits and emoluments thereto belonging or from or out of the same in any manner lawfully
or proceeding to him the said Alfred Darden and to his heirs and assigns forever upon the
following trust that is to say that if the said Septimius Darden his Executors or adm^r shall
not on or before the twentieth of December ensuing full pay & discharge the aforesaid debt
seven hundred and seventy one Dollars with its growing Interest that then it shall be
the duty of him the said Alfred Darden or so much as he shall be thereto required by them
the said Uriah Rawls and Jacob M. Duck Executors of Jacob Darden dec^d their Executors
or assigns & having first advertised in due form the time and place of sale to set up and sell
the two negroes to wit and Jack aforesaid to the highest bidder for ready money and out of the
money so raised to pay first the expenses incident to this present trust and then the debt
aforesaid with its growing Interest or so much thereof as shall then be due and unpaid and
the surplus if any in his hands shall remain he shall pay over to him the said
Septimius Darden or to his heirs or assigns In Testimony whereof the said Septimius
Darden Uriah Rawls & Jacob M. Duck Executors of Jacob Darden dec^d Alfred Darden
have hereunto set their hands and seals this day & date first before written

This Indenture made & entered into on the 14th day of December 1827 between Commodore
(J. T.) alias Powell of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the one part and
Story of the same County and State of the second part and Jackson Story of the same County
and State of the third part. Wherefore that whereas the said Commodore alias Powell
partly indebted unto the said Jackson Story by one bond bearing date the 10th day of August 1826
for the sum of Twenty Eight Dollars also one bearing date the 10th day of August 1826
payable two days after date for the sum of Twenty five Dollars and the said Commodore alias
Powell willing and desirous to appear and stand the said debt with its Interest that may
accrue thereon to him the said Jackson Story that for & in consideration of the sum of one
