Witnesseth that the said William Worton for and in consideration of the sum of
fifty Dollars came to him in hand paid by the said John Exm the receipt whereof
the said William Worton hath granted bargained and sold aliened conveyed
confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien convey confirm
unto the said John Exm his heirs and assigns forever one certain parcel of land
land containing by estimation three acres be the same more or less situate lying and
being in the County of Southhampton and bounded as follows To wit beginning
the west side of Smithfield road beginning at a sundry and at said road
thence to a stake a corner then from said stake along a course of marked trees
to Wilson's wellons and thence along Wilson's wellons and to a corner of said Wellons
North of Line from said corner then along said Line to a road and
near the said Smithfield road thence along said road to the beginning and also all
trees woods underwoods commons pastures profits commodities advantages
emoluments benefits and whatsoever to the said land at present or hereafter belonging
or any ways appertaining or in or upon the same growing happening passing
also the reversion and reversions remainder & remainders in & service of said
land and premises and of every part and parcel thereof and also all the estate
right title interest claim and demand whatsoever of them the said William Worton
of in or to the said premises and every part thereof I have and to hold all and
singular the said premises above mentioned & every part and parcel with all the
appurtenances unto the said John Exm his heirs and assigns to the only
proper use and behoof of the said John Exm his heirs and assigns forever and
the said William Worton for himself and his heirs the said parcel of Land and
every part thereof against himself his heirs and against all and every other
person or persons whatsoever to the said John Exm his heirs and assigns shall
well warrant and forever defend by these presents In Witness whereof the
