This Indenture made this 27th day of February in the Year Eighteen
hundred and twenty eight between John T. Barrow & Mary T. Barrow his wife of the
County of Southampton of the one part and Henry Barrow of the other part
Witnesseth that the said John T. Barrow and Mary T. Barrow his wife
for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and thirty one dollars to them with them
paid on or before the signing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof we the said John
Barrow & Mary T. Barrow do hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold devised
and confirmed unto the said Henry Barrow and to his heirs and assigns forever one
certain tract of land containing sixty six acres situate being the said John T. Barrow's
part of land which he got by the death of his father of the tract of land called the ^{Black} tract
owned by Joseph T. Cloud and others containing sixty six acres it being the said
John T. Barrow's part of land which he got by the death of his father of the tract of land
called the said more or less to have and to hold the said sixty six acres and with all and
singular the appurtenances thereto belonging to the said Henry Barrow his heirs
assigns forever to have and to hold the said John T. Barrow his wife
assigns forever and the said John T. Barrow and Mary T. Barrow his wife do hereby
their heirs covenant and agree with the said Henry Barrow his heirs and assigns
that we the said John T. Barrow and Mary T. Barrow his wife their heirs and assigns
shall and will warrant and forever defend the above mentioned Land and premises
unto the aforesaid Henry Barrow his heirs and assigns forever against the claims
title of all persons whatsoever In Witness whereof we the said John T. Barrow
and Mary T. Barrow his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and date above written

This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of February one thousand
eight hundred and twenty eight between Charles W. Goodwyn of the County of Southampton
of the first part. Court Harris of the second part and William Jackson of the third part
Witnesseth that the said Charles W. Goodwyn and Harcepa his wife hath for
consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by William Jackson Trustee
chosen and appointed by the said Charles W. Goodwyn and Court Harris the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged they the said Charles W. Goodwyn and Harcepa his
wife hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell
unto William Jackson one certain tract of land lying in the County of Southampton
and adjoining the lands of Henry Barrow and others it being the land assigned to the
aforesaid Harcepa Goodwyn by virtue of an order of Southampton County
and known by the Black Tract reference to the Commissioners report. well made of fully
appears containing by Estimation sixty acres be the same more or less together with the
following slaves to wit: One negro man Ephraim one negro woman Mary and one
negro woman Nancy. to have and to hold the aforesaid Land negroes together with the
future increase to the said William Jackson his heirs and assigns forever and the said
Charles W. Goodwyn and Harcepa his wife shall and lawfully warrant and forever defend the
title to the aforesaid land and negroes and their future increase to the said William Jackson
his heirs and assigns forever Upon Trust nevertheless that the said William Jackson
further witnesseth that whereas the said Court Harris hath become bound with
for the said Charles W. Goodwyn to James Jackson in a bond of five hundred and for one
dollar and seventy cents bearing date this 15th day of February 1828
