This Indenture made and entered into this 15th day of March in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight by and between Thomas Gray of the County of Southampton of the first part and Thomas P. Gray of the same County of the second part whereas the said Thomas P. Gray has assumed the the payment of a sum of money due from the said Thomas Gray to Louis Ruffin of the Town of Portsmouth and County of Norfolk the only true distributee and legal representative of Elizabeth Gray deceased to whom the said debt was originally due. Now this Indenture Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises and for the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Thomas P. Gray to the said Thomas Gray the receipt whereof the said Thomas Gray doth hereby acknowledge the said Thomas Gray hath granted bargain sold conveyed confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell convey confirm and confirm unto the said Thomas P. Gray the following property to wit a certain tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton being the said tract or parcel of land by the said Thomas Gray was purchased of Elizabeth Gray and is bounded by the lines of Henry Briggs John Urquhart Thomas Gray Thomas P. Gray and their heirs of a town called also a certain lot in the Town of Jerusalem with all the houses out houses and other appurtenances thereto belonging being the same lot purchased by Robert Gray dec^d of David Tallon and Catharine his wife and by deed conveyed to the said Robert Gray dec^d recorded in the Clerk's Office of Southampton County on the nineteenth day of March in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven also the following slaves to wit negro man by the name of Peter negro woman by the name of Larry and her children Bill Joe Matilda and Maryland a Gaily by the name of Kate together with the future increase of the same also all right title and interest which the said Thomas Gray now possesses or is entitled to or may hereafter possess or become entitled to whether in possession remainder or reversion as his at Law to Robert Gray dec^d. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land the said lot and houses slaves and interest in remainder or reversion hereby conveyed to him the said Thomas P. Gray and his heirs forever.
