our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight by and between Thomas
Gray of the County of Southampton of the first and Thomas P. Gray of the said
County of the second part whereas the said Thomas P. Gray has promised
the payment of a sum of money and from the said Thomas Gray to James Kiff
of the Town of Portsmouth and County of Norfolk the only heir surviving
and legal representative of Elizabeth Gray deceased whom the said debt was originally due
Now this Indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises
and for further consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the said Thomas
P. Gray to the said Thomas Gray the receipt whereof the said Thomas Gray will
hereby acknowledge the said Thomas Gray hath granted bargained sold and delivered
confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell enfeoff confirm delivered
unto the said Thomas P. Gray the following property to wit a certain tract of land
situate by me and being in the County of Southampton being the said tract
part of land by the said Thomas Gray was purchased of Elizabeth Gray aforesaid
and is bounded by the lands of Henry Briggs John Urquhart Thomas Gray
Thomas P. Gray and their heirs of a term of years also a certain lot in
the Town of Jerusalem with all the houses and tenements and other appurtenances
thereunto belonging being the same lot purchased by Robert Gray dec'd of Maria
Gallano and Catharine his wife and by them conveyed to the said Robert by Deed
recorded in the Clerk's office of Southampton County on the nineteenth day of
March in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven
also the following slaves to wit negro man by the name of Peter negro woman
by the name of Mary and her children Bill Joe Matilda and Mary and
a girl by the name of Adela together with the future increase of the same slaves
all right title and interest which the said Thomas Gray now hath or shall have
to or may hereafter have or become entitled to whether in possession remaining
or reversion a certain tract of land to Robert Gray aforesaid to have and to hold the
aforesaid tract of land the said lot and houses slaves and interest in
reversion or reversion jointly conveyed to him the said Thomas P. Gray of
